A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

We are more than half way through the Lenten season and rapidly approaching Easter. I have not talked with anyone in the past couple of weeks who is not eagerly anticipating the coming of spring weather and not just a date on the calendar. This has been an unusual Lent with our worshiping on Sunday in the Fellowship Hall rather than the Sanctuary because of the issues with the ceiling. We do not know how much longer we will be on the lower level, it is very possible that we will celebrate Easter down there.

To some of us this may be a time of disappointment or even discouragement. We are anxious about not knowing when we are going to get back into the sanctuary, how much the repair might cost and if it seems too costly, how will the congregation ever pay for it?

As we approach Easter, I think it is a good time to be dealing with these challenges.

I had been the pastor of the church I served in Princeton, Minnesota less than a year when we had a fire in the church building on Tuesday afternoon of Holy Week. The Fire burned a hole in the roof and through the front wall of the sanctuary, caused major water damage to the sanctuary and basement and filled the entire building with thick smoke. We obviously would not be worshipping there for a while. People immediately began to wonder what was the future of the church? Could it survive?

The church was in a fragile financial condition. I was the first full time pastor in over 10 years. The congregation and I each had taken a major leap of faith when I was called. Now we were going to be out of the building for an undetermined amount of time and facing significant repair costs. Some wondered if the church could survive. Was this a "sign" that the church should close?

We held our Easter morning service in the sanctuary of the United Methodist Church, squeezed in between their two services. I remember preaching about how the disciples who were so discouraged on Good Friday that they abandoned Jesus but were transformed and energized after Easter morning. I said we had the possibility of having this be a "good fire" if we lived our faith as an Easter people. That congregation is still engaged in ministry 40 years after that Holy Week fire.

So let us not lose hope. We do not know the future but we know who holds the future. We have the resources of our faith as an Easter people as we deal with the challenges that our building is presenting to us.

When we get closer to Easter, we will order one spectacular plant to represent all the wishes of the congregation and include the names of all the contributors in the bulletin, but the funds contributed will all go to the ceiling fund to help pay for the restoration.

Our Mission Targets for April: Love INC & Higher Ground

Hundreds of locally needy people are helped every year by Love In the Name of Christ— primarily by making referrals. The referrals are made to a wide variety of governmental agencies, local charitable organizations, to local churches, church pantries, or by calling on church volunteers to provide a service. Some of the services provided by church volunteers may include minor home repairs, a ride to a medical appointment, a friendly visit to a shut-in, or perhaps construction of a ramp for someone who is handicapped. Love INC offers its church volunteers a wide variety of ways to actively demonstrate Christ's love to people who are less fortunate.

Love Inc, and the federal Department of Human Services, have created the Higher Ground Life-Skills Program. This is our church's second target this month. Higher Ground is designed to teach important skills like nutrition, parenting, etc. to some of the clients shared by both agencies. When the program was first offered, it was a only a six week program in Wexford County offered one night a week at a local church. The program was so well received, however, that now the are classes offered twice a year in three separate locations. This month, the mission committee is asking that you consider making two donations:
A monetary donation to Love INC's ministry
A donation of toilet paper for the Higher Ground program. There will be a marked laundry basket downstairs for your donation. An explanation regarding this request will be given during the mission moment on Sunday April 6th.

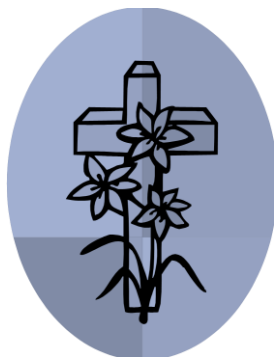
