## A MESSAGE FROM THE SEARCH COMMITTEE

We changed our UCC ad to reflect a full-time position in August. Since then, we have had 17 profiles sent to us. This brings our total, so far this year, to 41 applicants. The profiles are evenly divided between female and male candidates.

Currently, the Search Committee has 6 profiles that we are considering. Two of these profiles are brand new to us in the past week. We have meetings and interviews scheduled with 3 of these candidates for November and mid-December.

The earliest we would anticipate this is in the Spring, since most pastors required 60-90 days' notice to prepare for the move. We want to thank the congregation for their continued patience and support of the search process.

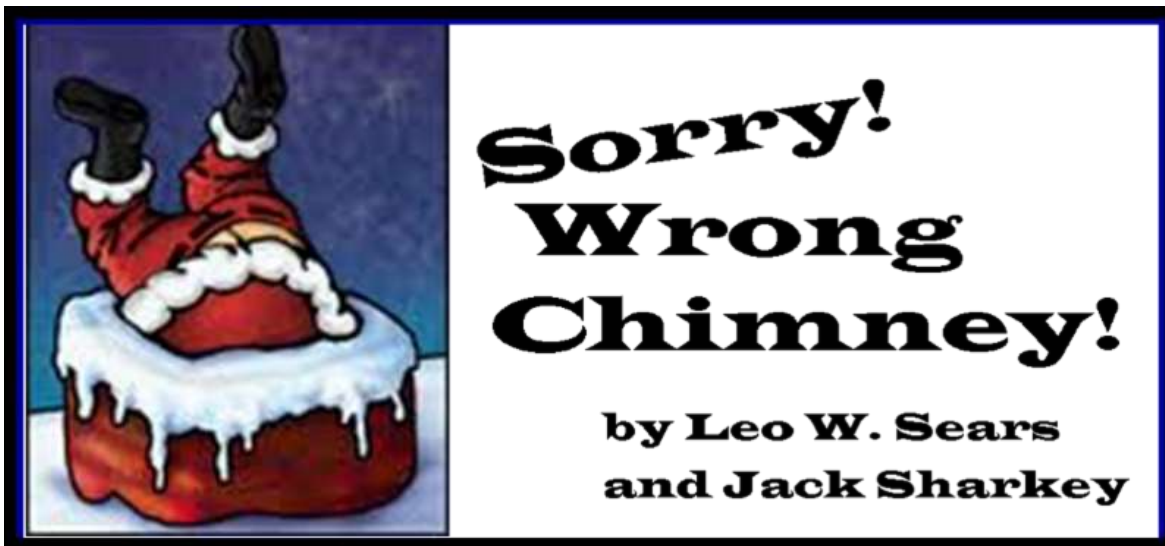

Once again we had a strong month which reduced our deficit even more. Rejoicing over a deficit of \$7,000 seems odd, but it is much better than the deficits we have faced in the past few years. The trustees are grateful that members and friends of the church continue to support it so that First Congregational Church can be an important presence in our community.

We hope that folks will recognize how vital the church is in their lives and fill out the pledge cards enclosed with the stewardship letter. Very soon the budget committee will be meeting to project our income and expenses for the coming year, and as with our own personal budgets, we need to have a sense of the income we can expect in order to make it work. Although we have certainly benefited from the generosity of our temporary pastors, we know that our expenses will be much higher once we have a settled pastor in place. The role of pastor is critically important in providing leadership as we move forward, and we must be willing to support that leadership.
