A Day with the Pope

It was a bright fall day in Rockville Maryland on September 23rd. Pope Francis was in Washington D.C. on his tour of America. I was visiting my daughter Kelly, who works in D.C. So we decided to brave the crowds and go see the Pope. It's a 1 hour commute to D.C. from Rockville, so we needed to start early. Surprisingly, the metro was nearly empty. Most people stayed home from work that day and worked from home.



In my faith journey years ago, I was a baptized and confirmed Catholic. In fact my confirmation name was Frances, after Saint Francis of Assisi. That was before my adult journey began.

We arrived with the happy and generally good-spirited people walking to where the Pope would circle in his popemobile near the south lawn of the White House. Vendors were selling flags, and even stuffed dolls of the Pope, but I resisted. But I must confess I did purchase a plaque to hang on my refrigerator. There was a genuine excitement in the air. Legions of security, Honor guards dressed in their finest, flags flying, and a polar bear holding up a sign "The Pope gives me Climate Hope". It wasn't all peace and love. There were a few loud-speakered protesters, but nothing could spoil the goodwill felt by all. Even the security people had a cordial attitude, as each piece of our paraphernalia was scrutinized.

When we finally found our spaces where we were going to stand, the people waiting with my daughter and I were from a mixture of cultural backgrounds, representing the areas in the world where there is a strong Catholic influence, college students that had camped out since 4 a.m., and people who were wanting a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Many that I spoke to thought the Pope was doing a good job of bringing down barriers, listening to the gay community, and bringing women's issues to the forefront. I believe he is a pope of the common people, and nothing is swaying him from his mission to serve the poor, help the homeless, and to be an advocate for the environment.

And when the Pope finally came, it was fast, but thrilling, and I think I caught his eye. Was I blessed by the Pope that day? You betcha!

- Participants shared about a variety of people who have helped them to grow spiritually, including Sunday School teachers, youth ministers, family members, someone who believed in them, Confirmation mentors, clergy, and well known leaders and people of faith - to name just a few.
- People were very clear about the skills and aptitudes needed in our leaders today - humor, kindness, grounded in faith, bravery, courage, fearlessness, adept with technology, experience of other cultures, outreach oriented, etc.
- There was great hope expressed for the future of the church. People wanted to see a woman General Minister and President, renewed commitment to social justice, the environment, ecumenism, interfaith dialogue, and ending poverty, racism and human trafficking.

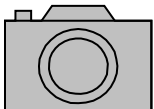
