The Rev. Doctor Alice Hunt was the keynote speaker and spoke in both the Friday and Saturday services. The theme of the conference was "Have No Fear" from Isaiah. I attended the budget meeting with John where I had the thrill of meeting a pastor from Grand Rapids who attended the same seminary as I did called Emmanuel School of Religion in Northeastern Tennessee. I also attended a workshop on the history of the UCC led by a lady known as B.B.Z. (Barbara Brown Zikmund) who is the recognized expert.

The most moving experience for me was the choir from Olivet College singing at Saturday's service. I have chills just writing about it.

Also, I have an announcement to make: I am leaving on November 9 to spend three months in Costa Rica, and from there my plans are unknown. I am also asking anyone who is willing to help me clean out my apartment to get in touch. I hope to see you at least one of the next two week's services.

# UCC Michigan Conference 2018 Annual Meeting

I have been asked to give an overview for you of our United Church of Christ Michigan Conference Annual Meeting, which took place on October 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> at the First Congregational Church of Charlotte. I have been attending these meetings since the mid-1980s, having moved north from Garden City, Michigan, in 1974 as a Presbyterian. Our pastor at that time told us to look for a Congregational Church. Finding a Presbyterian Church in Cadillac, I said, “There is no way we are driving that far to church” – famous last words, because here I am!

I attended my first national meeting, the synod, at Dallas/Ft. Worth, in 1989. This Annual Meeting in Charlotte had a different feel to me, as our keynoter, the Reverend Dr. Alice Hunt, immediate past President of the Chicago Theological Seminary, chose a very timely subject dealing with the whole issue of being a woman in a still very patriarchal society. Some churches still will not consider calling a woman to serve them. She chose as her Bible text Isaiah 40:9, telling us to “Be Not Afraid”, to preach the Good News, whoever and wherever we are. There was a good deal of discussion on both Friday, for the educational time, and Saturday, when more of our members were there.

Our host church was large enough to handle our main meeting, plus an annex for the workshops and budget/constitutional sessions. They provided lunch; however, the Friday banquet, recognizing new clergy to Michigan, plus those retiring and those who had passed away was held at a conference facility a few blocks away. The highlight of that evening for me was the honoring of Stan and Betsy Dole, who have been active in the Michigan United Church of Christ for over 50 years. I am blessed to call both of them my friends.

Our workshops covered everything from church growth, UCC History, Youth Issues, as well as issues of: Transgender; inclusive language; walking a labyrinth (which the Charlotte church has in their garden area); “Be Not Afraid to Sing, Sing, Sing” led by Marque Smith joining us from Canada. I attended his session just to listen, and he had a group of about 35 singing harmony well enough that they sang for the whole conference on Saturday. We were privileged to have the Olivet Gospel Choir sing for us during worship. That performance had many on their feet joining in.

There were displays from various groups – plus my UCC women with their Twocan Project and, of course, we had the business of passing a budget – voting on amending the Constitution of the National Church – our Michigan resolutions – election of new officers and board members – and hearing from our youth about their regional youth event.

All in all, the Annual Meeting was a productive, busy, energizing, though tiring, two day event. Besides getting the business finished, we got to see old friends and make new ones.

I have found that I learn something new each year even though I have been around for some time. I always feel after this meeting that I am proud to be a part of the United Church of Christ. Another year, come join with us.
