### A MESSAGE FROM OUR SUPPLY PASTOR

Isaiah 58:11b-12 "You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail. <sup>12</sup>Your people will rebuild the ancient ruins and will raise up the age-old foundations; you will be called Repairer of Broken Walls, Restorer of Streets with Dwellings." (NIV)

As we enter the Lenten Season we are called to reflect on our individual need for resurrection in our lives and our community. We are supposed to journey with the Disciples following Jesus on the road to the cross. But I struggle between my desire to find a dramatic action to take like overturning the tables in the temple and wanting to sit quietly and learn to be more holy and Christlike.

Resurrection comes from the Greek word *anastasis* which means "to stand up or to stand again". I have been wondering how we can find new ways to stand up in our world today.

This week has yet again reports full of overwhelming and horrific news with the Cease Fire not holding in Ukraine and the death toll rising above 5,000. 21 Coptic Christians brutally murdered, suicide bombers were able to penetrate a police station in Afghanistan and people here in my own community can't find jobs or a safe place to live and in some Michigan cities the water that comes from the tap is not fit to drink. How in a world so filled with crushing events can we "Stand Up" and be resurrected and perhaps bring healing in our broken world?

From a Facebook group I belong to here are 47 words, one for each day of Lent plus the Sundays (which technically are not counted as part of the 40 days) to use for personal meditation and renewal.

I believe collective prayer changes things, I believe we can together bring resurrection and "rebuild ruins and repair broken walls and restore streets" as the writer of Isaiah said.

Begin the season by emptying yourself, you may be surprised by what moves in to fill the void. Let's walk together in prayer and meditation toward the cross, toward Resurrection, toward Standing up for those unable to stand for themselves.



## BOOK STUDY, ANYONE?



### Our Mission Target For March: Love INC



Love INC

Love In the Name of Christ

Our local Love In the Name of Christ began serving the Cadillac area in 1991. At that time, it consisted of seven churches willing to join each other to aid local needy-residents. Now, Love INC has grown to 52 churches serving Wexford and Osceola counties.

Love INC makes four thousand referrals a year, screens applicants for Wexford County's Project Christmas and Osceola's Gifts for Kids, coordinates the Higher Ground life-skills learning program, and operates two INC Spot re-sale stores. The re-sale shops generate additional monies for Love INC operations, but they also provide low-cost (or free) items to many needy Love clients.

When a Love INC intake-worker receives a request for help, churches don't automatically get involved, however. Workers don't ask churches to help if other agencies or organizations can do it. Other times, the client will be referred to a variety of other church related options: a local pantry, a work force made up of church volunteers, an individual volunteer, an individual church to purchase a needed item, or sometimes several churches may be called upon and asked to combine their resources to provide whatever is needed. Later on, after clients are referred to the most appropriate resource, a Love INC follow-up-worker will call the client to be sure the request was filled.

Gifts to the Mission Fund, this month, will make it possible to help many of those people who'd otherwise "fall through the cracks". Your donation will make a real difference in the life of someone in our community. Anything you can contribute will be appreciated.
